
Tilstock Crib Festival

Alison Talbert Prayer Update February 2024

At work, January is always a slow month as people drift back from the Iong Christmas and New Year break, I enjoyed resting for almost 2 weeks. Half our study team took extra leave, so things didn't get going till the second half of the month when we invited community advisory board (CAB) members from Tezo and Takaungu locations to the research unit for a



week's training on research methods and our study aims. They enjoyed being put up in a hotel in exciting, big ol' Kilifi town and requested for more training!

There was sad news that one of the Upendo Children, a 19-year-old college student, Maureen, died in Kilifi County Hospital after a postpartum haemorrhage. I went to her funeral with several of the older children, board members and teachers. I was surprised to see that more than 500 people attended. Maureen's family will raise the baby girl with advice from the hospital nutritionist and will be supported with funds from Upendo donors to buy formula milk which is more expensive than an ordinary family can afford.

This month we are having a "wet run" of lab procedures for our study day 1 activities at Pwani University where we plan to do all our sampling for the main trial. Martha and I have volunteered to have an IV cannula and sampling line put in and have 4 timed blood samples taken. This gives the clinical and lab team the chance to practice their procedures, including data collection on the new tablets. We will then see if we can separate the serum and process the samples within half an hour, then freeze in liquid nitrogen to store for shipping as stipulated in the standard operating procedures for micronutrient analysis. We will also send them to the lab in Nairobi to check their turnaround time for results of our chosen vitamin and mineral tests for the interim safety analysis.

One of my goals for this year is to join (or start) another fellowship group so I have met Philip my district elder at the monthly joint fellowship in church, given him my contacts and asked to join the Mtaani, group that meets in members' homes. Being a bit shy and not knowing many church members well, I need to follow through.

Crosslinks have asked me to host a student on a short-term attachment in June. She is only 19 years old, that makes me feel ancient. My house has had a few improvements over the last month,



ceilings painted to hide watermarks, electrical sockets replaced, and loose covers sewn to hide the cat scratched 3-piece suite so I just need to get new curtains for the spare room then the house should be shipshape. The rains have stopped so there shouldn't be any more leaking ceilings...
