### NEWS! NEWS! NEWS! St. Alkmund's Re ordering

Thanks to two *very* generous legacies bequeathed to St. Alkmund's Church by two former members of our congregation, thoughts of re-ordering parts of church were discussed, and plans were drawn up in order to make improvements to the facilities we can offer, to make our church 'More inclusive'.

Eventually, plans were submitted to members of the Parochial Church Council (PCC) for approval, after which, they were then submitted to the Diocesan Advisory Committee (DAC) and after consideration, permission was granted and a **Faculty** was issued, in order that the works could 'go ahead'.

Four quotes were obtained by the Church Architects, and upon their advice, one of the Companies was selected, after which the PCC voted and agreed to the decision.

A date has been given for the works to commence, **beginning the third week of June,** and expected to take approximately, 12 weeks to complete!!

Obviously, this will cause some disruption and inconvenience, but we trust we will all be able to work around this, in order that the church can still operate!

#### Works will include -

Removal of 1 row of Pews at the back of Church Removal of 2 rows of Pews at the front of Church Removal of all Pews in The Lady Chapel Removal of the Pews by the former Sound System for the installation of new kitchen facilities

<u>North Porch</u> (no longer to be used as a kitchen) - Toilet to be upgraded + New Storage cupboards for use by flower ladies, etc.

The Display Cabinet, containing artefacts, to be moved a little to protect the contents from the sun, which shines right down on the cabinet, and enabling more cupboard space.
