

Prayer Update November 2022

Dear friends,

It's a blustery wet morning in darkest Cheshire so it seems like a good time to stay indoors and write this. Apologies for it being mid-month already, late but not as spectacularly as when I arrived at the 11am service at Canwell 45 minutes late and almost at the end of the all-age service! I'd put my phone on silent for the first service in Drayton Bassett, forgot to turn it on again so the lady on Waze was not talking to me



as I blindly (deafly?) went on dual carriageways to Burton/Derby (or who knows where?) before I realized the problem. It seems I am still in analogue mode, not to be trusted with apps.

I am currently staying in the spacious warm house of Jill, a member of St. Lawrence's Church, Biddulph, whilst she is in hospital awaiting the results of tests. I've been invited out for a meal this evening by members of a small group I attended when staying in Biddulph a few years ago so it does feel like a second home.

I'm in touch with friends in Kilifi by Whatsapp and also get the daily national security updates. Street crime is a growing problem particularly in Nairobi and the new president is in talks with the police service to counter it. The drought, a result of 4 consecutive inadequate rainy seasons, is affecting more counties, now over 5 million people. I noticed charcoal selling was on the increase before I left. In hard times people make use of the free natural resources around them to generate income but that is not good for climate change. Now people are realizing there is money in exporting baobab trees and a friend told me that the trees are being stockpiled whilst a new jetty is built in north Kilifi!

Meanwhile back in Cheshire this week I am taking my brother out tomorrow and meeting 2 of my cousins the next day. I haven't been to Martin's home for possibly 10 years. We tend to meet at family funerals so it will be great to see his son who is now a teenager! My church visit this Sunday is in Whitchurch, Shropshire, where my mother used to live.

Next week I am hitting the road again to visit a friend in Somerset and then on to friends, ex-Tanzania mission partners, in Kidderminster before my visit to Holy Trinity Church, Wolverhampton on the 27th . I fly back to Kenya on the 28th so I'm already halfway through my trip... Who knows when I will return again as next year looks busy with the new trial.

Perhaps next year you may have your own crib that you would like to bring along to share with everyone?


















CHURCHES TOGETHER CHRISTMAS CARD
