

PASTORAL LETTER

Dear Friends

We enter the autumn aware of great uncertainty around us and of great change having taken place in the last few months.

We have a new King and a new Prime Minister. We have ongoing war in Ukraine. We have strikes. We have a poorly resourced NHS and Social Care system. We have inflation.

Yet, we are still greatly blessed:

We have not been flooded in the same way as Pakistan. We have not had wild fires like Spain. We are not living in Ukraine. Our inflation rate is not expected to reach 100% this year, unlike the prediction for Argentina.

We have our friends and family. We have communities that have been strengthened in several ways through the Covid pandemic.

We have opportunities and resources to be able to give of ourselves and of our wealth to help others.

We have God who loves us and whose love remains constant and consistent in all the other changes that are going on around us.

There have been many commentators who have quoted from the words of the late Queen Elizabeth II about the difference God's love and peace brings. The evening before her coronation in 1952, she reflected prayerfully on these words: "The Peace of God will be the last word of the great service ... I may be carried to the heights above of exaltation or the depths of difficulty and depression: but the Peace of God will never leave me." In 2002 (50 years later), her Christmas message included the words: "I know just how much I rely on my own faith to guide me through the good times and the bad. I know that the only way to live my life is to try to do what is right, to take the long view, to give of my best in all that the day brings, and to put my trust in God."

You might like to make these words from a hymn your own as we move through the months


HM Queen Elizabeth II

They were married in St Alkmund's on the 26th August 1972 and on their Wedding Anniversary they travelled back to Whitchurch to visit the Church where their life together had began.

Ann was 21 years old and Dick was 23 when they married, they had both been in the RAF and met in the NAAFI in Biggin Hill. After they were married Ann had to leave the RAF as she was no longer allowed to stay in Service after marriage, soon afterwards they were posted to Cyprus.

The connection to Whitchurch came from Anne, who before their marriage had lived in Thompson Drive with her parents and brother.



Prayer Update September 2022

Dear Friends,

Apologies for this being late in writing this update. Since last month I've been "piano" as my friend Wendy would say, firstly with shingles then cellulitis but am now on the mend. I thank God that I am able to enjoy a restful night's sleep again.

Election day on August 9th went smoothly in most parts of Kenya, the results being upheld by the Supreme Court, and the president-elect Dr. William Ruto's inauguration is on Tuesday September 13th. There were some long faces amongst my neighbours as the main rival Raila Odinga was the favourite locally, however one lady told me she didn't care who got in as long as the price of maize flour went down. It has almost doubled in one year.





A lot of activities were put on hold over the election period, but work is returning to normal. We held a protocol development meeting last week and paid a courtesy call to Mtondia and Ngerenya dispensaries with the sub-county medical officer to introduce the study to the in-charges and scope out the infrastructure. Space is limited so we will probably be working from a tent in Mtondia! Fortunately, it is never cold here but it can be windy.

Upendo Children have taken on sponsorship of 3 new children Louisiana, Danson, and Francis who would otherwise not be in school. They are planning to take on a fourth but still vetting the applicants' family situations, as some claims to be orphans or children of widows are not true. I found the new children happily playing with the older ones when I visited last Saturday. Annet was sewing a pocket on an apron made out of a rice sack and Amani was making a motorbike handle out of sticks- very gender-stereotyped. However later they were all playing

football together.


I love learning new things and as well as getting a thorough briefing on the different species of mangroves during a recent day trip to the broad tidal Mida Creek, I was excited to hear a wild canary singing for the first time. I never knew there

were canaries in Kenya, I guess I thought they came from the Canary Islands. I am so happy to live in an area of outstanding natural beauty and biodiversity.

My thoughts are with people in the UK as they mourn the loss of the Queen and adjust to the changes in the monarchy and government- a time of major transition both here and there.

At the September FTW meeting the church representatives decided to recommend to the benefice PCCs that they undertake a survey to see what, post covid, people think our churches are doing well and what can be done better. The PCCs agreed and the FTW delegates have prepared a survey which will be available for you to complete between 9 October and 6 November – so please look out for it!

The survey questions are based around six indicators of a Healthy Church:

Worship – the worship of a healthy church will resonate with people and help them encounter God. It will reflect a deep rooted commitment to prayer.

Vision – a healthy church has a clear sense of purpose and direction in its task of building God's kingdom in its local community.

Leadership and Collaborative Ministry – part of good leadership is promoting team work and encouraging everyone to put their faith into action.

Active discipleship – a healthy church will be encouraging people of all ages to grow in their relationship with Jesus through prayer, bible study and other devotional activities.

Strong sense of community – every member of a congregation should feel a sense of belonging to the community and new people should feel a warm welcome. The relationship with the community beyond the church doors should be active and positive too.

Outward looking focus – reaching outwards is an important element of a church's role, both in loving and compassionate service and in helping people find faith.




Church Mission Society Mission Partner in Pakistan Update July 2022

Thank you for your message and concern. We are fine here in Lahore although we had some heavy rain here yesterday and there was some temporary and localised flooding as the storm drains could not cope. The rest of the country is in a far worse condition, especially Baluchistan and Sindh. OTS has restarted its Compassion Campaign to provide emergency relief to the most affected people.

Please pray for Pakistan especially those who are suffering from the flooding. Many have lost their homes, livelihoods, livestock and loved ones. It will take a huge amount of time and effort to rebuild. Please pray for the government, army and all relief workers as well as the suffering people.

I am giving thanks for a good time last week in Quetta, teaching Pakistan Church History to 16 Bible College students in the mornings and 22 OTS students in the evenings. I left just before the recent storms set in.
